Of the many functions of our alumni corporation, fundraising is one of the most important. As I'm sure you're aware from reading past newsletters, we did not have any significant Ohio Gamma alumni fundraising activities before 2000. As a result, we began the $21^{\rm st}$ century (Ohio Gamma's second 100 years) with almost no funds for scholarships or other leadership activities for our undergraduate Chapter members.

By 2009, as a result of significantly increased fundraising activities, the Alumni Corporation had received enough contributions to award our first scholarships. In 2014 increased donations allowed us to award over \$30,000 in scholarships. The funds for those scholarships come from annual alumni donations, and endowment funds set up by two Ohio Gamma alumni.

To assist those alumni brothers who may find it appealing to be able to make donations at their death as a part of their estate plan, and to make it easier, and recognition more available, the Alumni Corporation has established the Ohio Gamma Heritage Society.

To participate in this program, you need to make the Sigma Phi Epsilon Scholarship Fund #313642 of The Ohio State University Foundation a beneficiary of your estate, either by Will, Trust, IRA or life insurance beneficiary designation. There are also a few other ways to do this through more complex estate planning documents.

Once you have done this, if you will let John Waggoner of the Alumni Corporation know what you have done, you will automatically become a member of the Ohio Gamma Heritage Society, and be recognized as such (no dollar amounts will be associate with your donation until it is actually received).

The Alumni Corporation can provide additional details if you are interested, and can also direct you to one of several alumni brother professionals who can assist you.

Building these long term plans is an important part insuring our Chapter's future (and over time probably THE most important part), and we encourage you to consider becoming a member of the Heritage Society.

SIGEP ALUMNI AWARDS

THE BOB BARNETT OUTSTANDING ALUMNI SERVICE AWARD

Robin A. Schmidt

You came to OSU in 1952 after serving in the Marine Corp where you were awarded a Purple Heart for your service in the Korean War. As a machine gun squad leader you took part in the epic battle of the Chosin Reservoir in 1950 where temperatures fell to minus 35 degrees during the battle. This is the temperature in which frostbite occurs on both feet and your squad was forced to endure that.

While at OSU, fortunately you found Sigma Phi Epsilon. Your leadership skills were quickly recognized and you were named Ohio Gamma's Outstanding Pledge in 1952. You graduated with a BFA in Fine Arts in 1956.

After college you pursued your dream to be an Interior Designer. In 1960 you were named Executive Vice President for The Abel Corporation and in 1967 you became Director of Store Planning for Shoe Corporation of America. In 1968 you set out on your own as Owner and President of Robin Schmidt Design, where you specialized in health care, office and hospitality facilities. Then in 1986 you became an instructor of Interior Design at the prestigious Columbus College of Art and Design for 9 years while running your own design company.

The American Society of Interior Designers (ASID) is well known to those particularly in the field of design and you were an active participant since the society's beginnings, serving in numerous ways at the Association, Chapter and National level. You received the National ASID Chapter Medalist Award and

Presidential Citations and received a standing ovation for your production of a multimedia presentation at the ASID National Conference.

Over the many years of your career, you have presented CEU's, taught at CCAD and found time to devote to museums, arts councils, and other community activities. In 1975 you were Chairman of the Downtown Arts Festival

You have been listed in Who's Who in the Midwest and Who's Who in Interior Design. In 2003 you were elected to a Fellowship in the American Society of Interior Designers.

So Ohio Gamma was fortunate to have a man of your expertise available in 1970 when you with your fellow alumni brothers, 2009 Service Award winners John Petro and Dick Walters found the old houses on Woodruff were beyond repair and we needed new facilities. The old Alpha Epsilon Pi house had become available and your AVC put together the necessary funds to purchase the new house after selling the old houses.

But the new house had been trashed when the AEP's moved out so your expertise in design was critical to the remodeling and refurbishing of the chapter house in time for the undergrads to move in for fall of 1970. You provided a great deal of time and talent to the new house and Ohio Gamma was better for it.

Since our founding in 1908 there have been a number of critical times where the future of Sig Ep at OSU was in real jeopardy. Often, chapters leave campus and never return if alumni don't step forward.

This was one of those critical times and had you, John and Dick not come together at that time for Ohio Gamma, we might not be here today for this celebration.

So for your work for our chapter in the time of one of our greatest needs, we present you with the 2015 Bob Barnett Outstanding Alumni Service Award.

THE GEORGE E. SMITH DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Judge Robert P. Ringland

You came to The Ohio State University from Amelia High School in 1963. While in High School you ran track and cross country, were a member of the Honor Society and voted Outstanding Senior Male by your classmates.

Since you knew few on campus you joined Sig Ep hoping to make friends and brothers. It was a rewarding experience and in a time known for pranks you had your share. In fact, you and another brother felt the front door of the Pike house should not be red like ours and you took a paint brush and paint to their door a few times in your career at Sig Ep. The nickname "Ringy" became a natural. You served the Chapter as Vice President, made many good friends amongst your brothers and are still involved with Sig Ep to this day.

With a strong desire for law school you were serious about your studies and your campus engagement. You were selected to Spinx Men's honorary, Phi Alpha Theta honorary, Mershon Honorary, and Ohio Staters while at OSU. You returned to Cincinnati to attend Law school at the University of Cincinnati graduating in 1970.

The early 70's marked the beginning of your law career and you served a variety of positions before being appointed Assistant Prosecuting attorney in Clermont County in 1974 and Clermont County Court Judge in 1977. 1983 saw your election to Common Pleas Judge, a post you held until 2008 when you were elected to your current position as Appellate Judge, 12th District Court of Appeal.

Along the way you were assigned as a Trial Judge by the Ohio Supreme Court and for 6 years you received the Supreme Court Judicial Service Award.

Child abuse issues in the legal system became a passion for you and your award

winning articles on Child Abuse Evidence issues have been published by university law reviews and credited with reforming the Ohio Evidence Hearsay rules. During your career you have written more legal opinions published in the Official Ohio Reports than any other trial judge in Ohio.

Even with such a demanding career you found time for many public service projects. You were a chairman of the Ohio Victims of Crime, Public Awareness Advisory Council, The Governor Task Force on Investigation and Prosecution of Child Abuse and Child Sex Abuse Cases and a peer review consultant for the U.S. Department of Justice. You received the Award of Merit and Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America for your service as Clermont County Boy Scout Chairman, an organization like Sig Ep very much committed to the development of Balanced Men.

You are listed in "Who's Who in American Law" and are a frequent lecturer at the Ohio Judicial College as well as an instructor at the U.C. Batavia Branch in Criminal Justice. The Clermont County Review summed it up well when they identified you as "one highly respected judge".

Our Ohio Gamma alumni feel the same and are proud to honor you as a 2015 George E Smith Distinguished Alumni!

THE GEORGE E. SMITH DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Scott Phillips, Jr.

It was only 14 years ago that you came to OSU as an enthusiastic young man already dedicated to your strong family beliefs and a huge desire to make your mark in the world.

You spent your high school days while at Cleveland's Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School working long hours at your family restaurant, and two a days during football season as the team's quarterback. As a senior in High School you were named Athlete of the Year, not simply for your athleticism, but your work as captain of both the football and hockey teams. You may not have been ready to be OSU's quarterback but you moved from college intramurals to spending 6 seasons of arena football and semi-pro football in northeast Ohio.

When you arrived at OSU, you were unimpressed with what you saw of fraternity life... And in an effort to decline invites to the Greek community you met SigEp and were impressed with the Balanced Man program and joined immediately. You were on the undergrad executive board for all but 10 weeks of your

college career, and specifically served two terms as our chapter president. During your tenure, the chapter grew, won our first of what is now seven consecutive Buchanan Cups, raised the GPA to over 3.0, and you were the driving force to establish our chapter as one of the earliest Residential Learning Communities when our AVC didn't even realize how important that was! That accomplishment has served us extremely well over the years, and for which we are extremely proud as a chapter.

After graduation, you returned to your beloved Cleveland area and after a short time as a financial services rep, you presented a proposal to the City leaders to fund a non-profit marketing consortium developed to recruit young professionals to live in downtown Cleveland and its nearby neighborhoods. No one could be a better advocate for Cleveland and its downtown community, and your enthusiasm and tremendous success with the consortium led to a new career in real estate when you became a realtor for Howard Hanna and then a move to Keller Williams.

The leadership of Keller Williams quickly noticed your success and by May of 2009, just 5 years out of college, you became a partner at Keller Williams Greater Cleveland. By July 2014 you were named CEO & Operating Partner of Keller Williams Greater Cleveland. Amidst the rise to leadership at KW, you went back to your roots and created a family partnership that forever secured Guarino's, your family restaurant, and in fact Cleveland's oldest restaurant, to carry on for generations to come.

As CEO, you have successfully lead Keller Williams Greater Cleveland to over \$300 million in annual sales and the #1 workplace in Cleveland the last 5 years. Along the way you were a regular participant in the Real Trends Emerging Leaders Program and picked up an award as the National Association of Realtors Top "30 under 30" and then, while still only

Carl Thomas Abell

Carl was born January 14, 1927 in Cleveland, Ohio. His family moved to Medina, Ohio in the 1930's and he grew up on the family's dairy farm. He died October 27, 2015. Carl graduated from The Ohio State University in Dairy Food Science. While at OSU he played football and was an Ohio State Big 10 National Champion wrestler, chosen as an alternate to the Olympic wrestling team in 1952 and 1954.

Carl returned to operate the family farm and brought pasteurized milk to Medina County. He would later start the convenient store food chain Stop-N-Go Foods of Medina County. He was a Multi-Diamond Paul Harris Fellow for the Rotary Foundation and he strongly upheld the Tenants of Rotary in his life and personal beliefs. He is survived by his wife Sherry, 6 children and 16 grandchildren.

Dr. Richard Snyder Traul

Dr. Richard "Dick" Snyder Traul was born September 28, 1940 and passed away June 30, 2015 in Bellefontaine, Ohio. A 1958 graduate of Bellefontaine High School, he earned an undergraduate degree from The Ohio State University in 1962 and his medical doctorate in 1965. He trained in anesthesia at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston and was a Major in the U.S. Army Medical Corps stationed in Stuttgart, Germany before moving to Kalamazoo, Michigan in 1971, where he practiced for 23 years.

He retired and returned to Bellefontaine in 1995 where he worked part-time at Mary Rufan Hospital, caring for families who had also been cared for by his late father and grandfather. Dr. Traul is survived by his wife Nancy, 3 children and 6 grandchildren.
